From that first handful of people our membership has grown to include terrier judges, breeders, and enthusiasts. Most of our members are actively involved in their local and/or regional breed clubs as well as belonging to their respective national club.

After many years of hard work, the ATCWV was licensed by the American Kennel Club in 1999 with our first Group Show held on August 11, 2000. More than 250 terriers representing all AKC sanctioned terrier breeds participated in obedience, conformation, and junior showmanship. Since that time

two active members. Regular members are the life blood of a club.

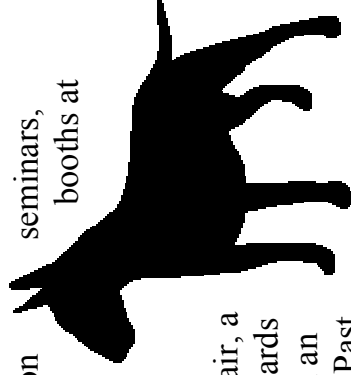

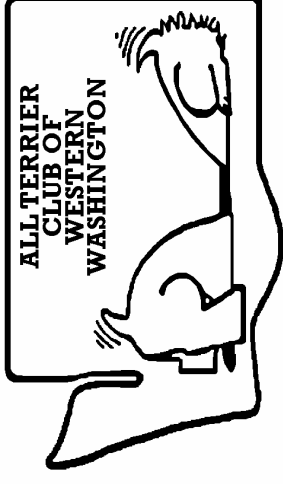
